RETROFITTING OF NOISE BARRIERS ON TSING TSUEN BRIDGE
AT TSING YI AND TSUEN WAN APPROACHES

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for the Environment, Transport and Works under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Acting Permanent Secretary for the Environment, Transport and Works (Transport) proposes to execute the road works as shown on Plans Nos. HMW6764TH-GZ0001 and HMW6764TH-GZ0002 (the 'Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plans and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) erection of a segment of approximately 5-metre high and 160-metre long noise barrier along the footpath of the eastbound slip road from Tam Kon Shan Interchange to Tsing Tsuen Bridge near On Chiu House and On Pak House of Cheung On Estate, Tsing Yi;
- (ii) erection of a segment of approximately 6-metre high and 160-metre long cantilevered noise barrier along the footpath of the eastbound carriageway of Tsing Tsuen Bridge near On Pak House of Cheung On Estate, Tsing Yi;
- (iii) erection of two segments of approximately 6-metre high cantilevered noise barrier with length of approximately 90 metres and 225 metres along the verge and the central divider of the eastbound carriageway of Tsing Tsuen Bridge near On Chiu House and On Pak House of Cheung On Estate, Tsing Yi;
- (iv) erection of two segments of approximately 6-metre high and 150-metre long cantilevered noise barrier along the footpath and the central divider of the eastbound carriageway of Tsing Tsuen Bridge near Hoi Sing Mansion of Riviera Gardens, Tsuen Wan;
- (v) erection of two segments of approximately 7-metre high cantilevered noise barrier with length of approximately 300 metres and 220 metres along the footpath and the central divider of the eastbound carriageway of Tsing Tsuen Road near Hoi Fung Mansion and Hoi Kwai Mansion of Riviera Gardens, Tsuen Wan;
- (vi) temporary closure and resurfacing of sections of the existing vehicular bridges, carriageways and footpaths; and
- (vii) ancillary works including street lighting, traffic aids, landscaping, geotechnical and drainage works.
