

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)
(Notice under section 8(2))

KOWLOON BAY ELEVATED WALKWAY SYSTEM

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. KM8026a (the 'Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a covered elevated walkway system of approximately 550 metres(m) long, which consists the follows:—

Portion A : Links up the existing south Wai Yip Street footbridge leading to the MTR Kowloon Bay Station via Telford Gardens, runs along Sheung Yuet Road as the main trunk, and ends at Exchange Tower and One Kowloon respectively;

Portion B : Runs along Wang Chiu Road and links up the covered elevated walkway system of Portion A via Exchange Tower, and ends at Enterprise Square Five (Megabox);

Portion C : Connects Enterprise Square Five (Megabox) and Enterprise Square Three;

Portion D : Connects Enterprise Square Three and Manhattan Place;

- (ii) construction of associated staircases, escalators and lifts for the proposed elevated walkway system at (i);
- (iii) modification of a section of Wang Hoi Road near the junction with Sheung Yuet Road, including the provision of a pedestrian crossing;
- (iv) temporary closure and reconstruction/modification of a central median, a refuge island, and sections of the existing Lam Fook Street Sitting-out Area, the existing staircase of a footbridge, carriageways and footpaths;
- (v) permanent closure of a planter and refuge islands, and sections of the existing staircase of a footbridge, carriageways and footpaths; and
- (vi) ancillary works including landscaping and drainage works.

The Plan and scheme may be inspected by members of the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—
