Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plans No. 60022408/S2/1.1 to 60022408/S2/1.3 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plans and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of mainly dual 2-lane district distributor roads of about 1 700 metres (m) long including Roads D3A, D4A and a section of road on Kai Tak Bridge and associated footpaths;
- (ii) construction of single 2-lane access roads of about 590 m long in total including Roads L12a, L12b, L12c, L13a, L13b, and L14 with vehicular underpass and associated footpaths;
- (iii) construction of footpaths of about 410 m long connecting to the proposed associated footpaths in (i) and (ii);
- (iv) construction of landscaped deck structure integrated with noise barriers in (v) of about 1 400 m long above Road D3A and Road D4A (subject to detailed design);
- (v) construction of noise barriers, vertical noise barriers integrated with landscaped deck structure and with provision for pedestrian crossings, and overhanging vertical noise barriers integrated with landscaped deck structure of about 1 100 m long in total along Road D3A and Road D4A (subject to detailed design);
- (vi) construction of central medians/traffic islands, pedestrian crossings and amenity areas;
- (vii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing carriageways into footpaths, central medians/traffic islands or amenity areas;
- (viii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into carriageways, central median/traffic island, pedestrian crossings or amenity areas;
- (ix) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing central medians/traffic islands into carriageways;
- (x) permanent closure and demolition of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central median/traffic island and pedestrian crossings;
- (xi) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths and central medians/traffic islands; and
- (xii) ancillary works including construction of vehicular run-ins, drainage pipes and outfalls, as well as water, sewerage, utilities, lifts, staircases and landscaping works.
