

## FORESHORE AND SEA-BED (RECLAMATIONS) ORDINANCE (Chapter 127)

(Notification under section 5)

**CONSTRUCTION OF DRY WEATHER FLOW INTERCEPTOR**  
**AT CHERRY STREET BOX CULVERT NEAR NEW YAU MA TEI TYPHOON SHELTER**

Notice is hereby given that the undertaking described in the Schedule below is proposed. A copy of the plan delineating and describing the proposed undertaking and the foreshore and sea-bed to be affected thereby has been prepared and may be inspected by the public free of charge on the Lands Department website ([www.landsd.gov.hk](http://www.landsd.gov.hk)) under Government Notices, at the Lands Department Survey and Mapping Office, 23rd Floor, North Point Government Offices, 333 Java Road, North Point, Hong Kong (where copies can be purchased on order) and at the Yau Tsim Mong District Office, Public Enquiry Service Centre, Ground Floor, Mong Kok Government Offices, 30 Luen Wan Street, Mong Kok, Kowloon during the following hours:—

Any person who considers that he has an interest, right or easement in or over the foreshore and sea-bed so described may, by notice in writing delivered to the Director of Lands, 20th Floor, North Point Government Offices, 333 Java Road, North Point, Hong Kong before the expiration of two months from the date of this notice, object to the proposed undertaking. The notice of objection shall describe the interest, right or easement of the objector and the manner in which he alleges he will be affected.

**SCHEDULE**

*Description of the undertaking and the manner in which the foreshore and sea-bed will be affected by the proposed undertaking*

*Foreshore and sea-bed affected*

Approximately 2 310 square metres of foreshore and sea-bed situated at New Yau Ma Tei Typhoon Shelter as delineated and shown edged red on a plan, numbered KM8937, deposited in the Land Registry.

- (i) As a temporary works area for construction of dry weather flow intercepting facilities and an additional drainage outfall at the existing Cherry Street Box Culvert (CSBC), and the ancillary works. The drainage outfall of internal size about 4.8 metres wide by 3.5 metres high is at an invert level of about 1 metre below Principal Datum. Part of the existing seawall will be modified to accommodate the drainage outfall.
- (ii) Temporary works will be carried out at the outlet of CSBC to facilitate the construction of the proposed works. The constructions of temporary works will be removed upon completion of the proposed works.
- (iii) No dredging and excavation of the sea-bed will be required.

The area of foreshore and sea-bed affected is shown on the plan on the next page for identification purposes only. The area is more particularly shown on the plan numbered KM8937 above referred to.
