

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

(Notice under section 8(2))

INTEGRATED BASEMENT FOR WEST KOWLOON
CULTURAL DISTRICT (PART)

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. KZ840 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a carriageway of approximately 500 metres long below the proposed ground level with associated footpaths, pick-up/drop-off areas, pedestrian crossings and central medians/traffic islands; and
- (ii) ancillary works including civil and structural engineering, mechanical and electrical, drainage, water and utilities works.

The Plan and scheme may be inspected by members of the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—
