## PWP ITEM NO. 7332CL (PART) WEST KOWLOON RECLAMATION—MAIN WORKS (REMAINDER)— FOOTBRIDGE AT JUNCTION OF SHAM MONG ROAD AND TONKIN STREET WEST IN SHAM SHUI PO

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. KZ850 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a covered four-span footbridge with associated lifts and lift towers, covered staircases, covered escalators, footbridge abutments and footbridge columns at the junction of Sham Mong Road/Tonkin Street West;
- (ii) construction of footpath;
- (iii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing carriageways into footpath, footbridge abutment and planter;
- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into lift towers, footbridge abutments, footbridge columns and planters;
- (v) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing central median/traffic island into carriageway;
- (vi) permanent closure and conversion of the existing pedestrian crossings into carriageway, footpaths, central medians/traffic islands and planters;
- (vii) demolition and conversion of sections of the existing planters into footpaths and footbridge abutment;
- (viii) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing footpaths and central medians/traffic islands;
- (ix) temporary demolition and reconstruction of sections of the existing planters; and
- (x) ancillary works including construction of a temporary covered staircase, as well as drainage, water, slope and landscaping works.
