**NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING
 PERMANENT CLOSURE OF A SECTION OF NAM FUNG PATH; AND
 TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF SECTIONS OF
 NAM FUNG ROAD AND NAM FUNG PATH**

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 9 May 2016 (the 'Order'), authorized:-

- (I) the permanent closure of part of the footpath widths of the section of Nam Fung Path at a point about 120 metres southeast of its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5 with effect from 27 May 2016; and
- (II) the temporary partial closure of the section of Nam Fung Road between its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path and Nam Fung Road Rest Garden, and the section of Nam Fung Path between its junction with Nam Fung Road and a point about 140 metres southeast of its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path, as delineated and shown in yellow and green respectively on the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5 during the period from 27 May to 31 December 2016,

for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the South Island Line (East). A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5 (the 'Plan') may be inspected by the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:-

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the roads affected by the Order on 13 May 2016.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the roads or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further closure of the same part or parts of the roads or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure will be published if and when such an order is made.

<i>The roads to be affected</i>	<i>Description of the works and the manner in which the roads will be affected</i>
(a) Part of the footpath widths of the section of Nam Fung Path at a point about 120 metres southeast of its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5.	Part of the footpath widths will be permanently closed for the provision of the railway viaduct of the South Island Line (East).
(b) The section of Nam Fung Road between its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path and Nam Fung Road Rest Garden, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5.	Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel, ventilation and plant building, and the associated railway facilities of the South Island Line (East), and reinstatement works.
(c) The section of Nam Fung Path between its junction with Nam Fung Road and a point about 140 metres southeast of its junction with Wong Chuk Hang Path, as delineated and shown in green on the Plan numbered SILE/G07/0002/5.	Parts of the carriageway and footpath widths will be temporarily closed to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel, railway viaduct and the associated railway facilities of the South Island Line (East), and reinstatement works.
