Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. 60328348/GAZ_RIW/131 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of an elevated carriageway connecting Lin Tak Road and Sau Mau Ping Road and associated junction/road modification works;
- (ii) construction of at grade carriageways, at grade footpaths and central reserves/refuge islands;
- (iii) modification and realignment of a section of the existing slip road connecting Tseung Kwan O Road and Sau Mau Ping Road (Sau Mau Ping bound);
- (iv) modification and realignment of a section of the existing slip road connecting Tseung Kwan O Road and Sau Mau Ping Road (Lam Tin bound);
- (v) modification and realignment of a section of the existing slip road connecting Tseung Kwan O Road and Lin Tak Road (Kwun Tong bound);
- (vi) modification and realignment of a section of the existing Lin Tak Road;
- (vii) modification of the existing junction at Lin Tak Road/Pik Wan Road;
- (viii) construction of a semi-enclosure, cantilever noise barriers and a vertical noise barrier at Sau Mau Ping Road and Lin Tak Road;
- (ix) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing at grade carriageways into at grade footpaths and central reserves/refuge islands;
- (x) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing elevated carriageway into elevated footpaths;
- (xi) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing at grade footpaths into at grade carriageways, central reserves/refuge islands and verge;
- (xii) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing elevated footpath into elevated carriageway;
- (xiii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing central reserves/refuge islands into at grade carriageways and at grade footpath;
- (xiv) temporary closure and modification of sections of the existing at grade carriageways, elevated carriageway, at grade footpaths, elevated footpaths and central reserves/refuge islands;
- (xv) temporary closure of sections of the existing at grade carriageways, elevated carriageway, at grade footpaths, elevated footpaths and central reserves/refuge islands; and
- (xvi) ancillary works including construction of retaining walls and slopes, as well as drainage, water, utilities, slope stabilization, street lighting and landscaping works.
