Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. RD/GZ001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a single two-lane carriageway with associated amenity areas, footpaths, bus lay-by, coach parking area, central reserves/traffic islands, vehicular ingresses and egresses. cul-de-sac and pedestrian crossings to connect to Ying Hei Road and Tung Chung
- (ii) construction of footpaths, cycle track, cycle parking area, amenity areas and bus lav-bvs to the north of Ying Hei Road;
- (iii) construction of carriageway to the north of Tung Chung Waterfront Road;
- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths at the junction of Ying Hei Road, Tung Chung Waterfront Road and Yi Tung Road into pedestrian crossings;
- (v) temporary closure and reconstruction of a section of the existing footpath of Ying Tung Road Northbound;
- (vi) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing central reserves/traffic islands at Ying Hei Road and Tung Chung Waterfront Road;
- (vii) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways, central reserves/traffic islands, footpaths and open space; and
- (viii) ancillary works including construction of waterworks, drainage, sewerage and landscaping
