

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

PROVISION OF LIFTS AT FOOTBRIDGE NO. KF56
ACROSS NEW CLEAR WATER BAY ROAD
NEAR CHOI WAN SHOPPING CENTRE PHASE 2
IN KWUN TONG DISTRICT AND WONG TAI SIN DISTRICT

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close permanently a section of the existing footpath; and temporarily sections of the carriageways, footpaths, ramp and bridge deck within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. CE58/GAZ/KF56/0001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto. The Plan and scheme were referred to in G.N. 7276 published on 25 September 2015 and 2 October 2015. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that as from 26 November 2016, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the section of the existing footpath to be permanently closed, shall be extinguished; and from 26 November 2016 to 25 November 2017, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the carriageways, footpaths, ramp and bridge deck to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the construction of two lifts at the existing footbridge No. KF56 across New Clear Water Bay Road near Choi Wan Shopping Centre Phase 2 and Sing Yin Secondary School, the construction of elevated platforms to connect the proposed lifts with the existing footbridge, the construction of a footpath to connect the proposed lift near Choi Wan Shopping Centre Phase 2 with the existing footpath, the modification of the existing ramp of the existing footbridge No. KF56 to connect with the proposed elevated platform near Choi Wan Shopping Centre Phase 2 and other ancillary works.

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected carriageways, footpaths, ramp and bridge deck on 18 November 2016.

Any person entitled to compensation under the Ordinance may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing, 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure.
