

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

RECONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVEMENT OF TUEN MUN ROAD

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing at-grade carriageways, vehicular bridges, footbridges and footpaths within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. 9B905/GAZ/100 to 9B905/GAZ/116 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as modified by Modification Plans Nos. 9B905/GAZ/201A, 9B905/GAZ/202, 9B905/GAZ/211, 9B905/GAZ/215 and 9B905/GAZ/216 ('the Modification Plans'). The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 2779 published on 4 May 2007 and 11 May 2007. The Modification Plans were referred to in G.N. 460 published on 25 January 2008 and 1 February 2008. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 9 January 2017 to 8 January 2018, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing at-grade carriageways, vehicular bridges, footbridges and footpaths to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the remaining works in relation to reconstruction and re-alignment of Tuen Mun Road between Tsuen Wan and Sam Shing Hui to current expressway standards with the provision of hard shoulders, installation of cantilever/vertical noise barriers or semi-noise enclosures, and other ancillary works.

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected at-grade carriageways, vehicular bridges, footbridges and footpaths on 30 December 2016.

Any person entitled to compensation under the Ordinance may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing, 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure.
