NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING TEMPORARY ALTERATION OF A SECTION OF THE FOOTPATH ADJACENT TO THE FORMER POLICE OFFICERS' CLUB

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has, by order made on 21 August 2017 (the 'Order'), authorized the temporary alteration of the section of the footpath adjacent to the former Police Officers' Club between its junction with Victoria Park Road and a point about 150 metres north of the junction, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G34/0049/2 during the period from 2 October 2017 to 28 February 2018 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Shatin to Central Link. A description of the works to be carried out, the section of the footpath to be affected and the manner in which it will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing on 22nd Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong so as to reach the Secretary before the expiration of one year from the alteration of the relevant part or parts of the footpath or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the footpath affected by the Order.

Notice is hereby given that further alteration of the same part or parts of the footpath or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for alteration will be published if and when such an order is made.

SCHEDULE

The footpath to be affected Description of the works and the manner in which the footpath will be affected

The section of the footpath adjacent to the former Police Officers' Club between its junction with Victoria Park Road and a point about 150 metres north of the junction, as delineated and shown in red on the Plan numbered SCL/G34/0049/2.

The footpath will be temporarily altered with a shift in alignment in close proximity to facilitate the construction of the railway tunnel and the associated railway facilities of the Shatin to Central Link, and reinstatement works.
