Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. CE53/KS23/GZ/0001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a lift at the existing subway No. KS23 near Fa Po Street in Sham Shui Po District and Surrey Lane in Kowloon City District;
- (ii) construction of a footpath to connect the proposed lift in (i) to the existing subway No. KS23:
- (iii) construction of an elevated platform with associated column to connect the proposed lift in (i) to the access lane leading to Fa Po Street;
- (iv) construction of ramps and staircases with associated columns;
- (v) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into the ramps in (iv);
- (vi) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing staircase into the lift in (i), the footpath in (ii) and the elevated platform with associated column in (iii);
- (vii) permanent closure and conversion of the existing steps into the ramps in (iv);
- (viii) permanent closure and demolition of sections of the existing staircase;
- (ix) demolition and conversion of sections of the existing vegetation cover into the lift in (i), the footpath in (ii), the elevated platform in (iii) and the staircases with associated columns in (iv);
- (x) demolition of a section of the existing vegetation cover;
- (xi) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways and footpaths; and
- (xii) ancillary works including electrical and mechanical, drainage, lighting, slope and landscaping works.
