

CHINESE MEDICINE ORDINANCE (Chapter 549)

ORDER MADE BY THE CHINESE MEDICINE PRACTITIONERS BOARD OF
THE CHINESE MEDICINE COUNCIL OF HONG KONG

Notice is hereby given that the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board of the Chinese Medicine Council of Hong Kong, after an inquiry on 7 December 2017 conducted pursuant to section 98 of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Chapter 549, Laws of Hong Kong), was satisfied that the following charge of professional misconduct against HO Wai-kit, registered Chinese medicine practitioner (registration no.: 005274), is proved:—

In the course of acupuncture and cupping treatment of a patient on 19 August 2016, she failed to discharge her professional responsibility to her patient by causing blisters on the skin of the patient, in contravention of section 2(1) in Part 3 of the Code of Practice for Registered Chinese Medicine Practitioner in Hong Kong.

For the above established charge, registered Chinese medicine practitioner HO Wai-kit was found guilty in Hong Kong of misconduct in a professional respect and in breach of the conditions imposed by the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board on her practice of Chinese medicine under section 98(2)(b) and 98(2)(e) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance respectively. Pursuant to section 98(3) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance, the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board ordered on 7 December 2017 that, for the above established charge, HO Wai-kit be reprimanded.

In accordance with section 104 of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance, the above order made by the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board is hereby published.
