## PWP ITEM NO. 063KA— TAMAR DEVELOPMENT PROJECT PROPOSED ELEVATED WALKWAYS ACROSS HARCOURT ROAD AND TIM MEI AVENUE

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. PMB1/6104/EW/GZ001a (the 'Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of an elevated walkway across Harcourt Road connecting Tamar and the footpath adjacent to Admiralty Centre. The proposed elevated walkway is composed of a western walkway of approximately 5 metres (m) wide and an eastern covered walkway of approximately 8 m wide. The western and eastern walkways are joined at the northern and southern ends;
- (ii) construction of a covered elevated walkway of approximately 6.5 m wide across Tim Mei Avenue connecting Tamar and the existing Citic Tower Elevated Walkway System;
- (iii) construction of escalators, staircase and lifts associated to the proposed elevated walkways;
- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing carriageway into footpath;
- (v) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths and amenity areas; and
- (vi) ancillary works including drainage, landscaping and utility works.
