Foreshore and sea-bed affected

Approximately 4.36 hectares of foreshore and sea-bed situated at San Shek Wan, Lantau Island as delineated and shown edge red on a plan, numbered ISM2322b, deposited in the Land Registry. Description of the undertaking and the manner in which the foreshore and sea-bed will be affected by the proposed undertaking

- (i) Laying of a submarine outfall of about 350 millimetres in internal diameter and about 1 100 metres in length from the shore by horizontal directional drilling at a depth of up to 65 metres below the seabed. Dredging of sea-bed is not required, except the end section at the outermost 39 metres of the outfall.
- (ii) The end section will be constructed by dredging to about 6 metres below the seabed and will be reinstated by backfilling with crushed rocks.
