- (iv) temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing footpath, cycle track and amenity area;
- (v) temporary closure of sections of the existing footpath, cycle track and amenity area; and
- (vi) ancillary works including site formation, landscaping, drainage, street lighting and utilities works, construction of retaining walls and slope, and installation of street furniture and traffic aids.
