

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

(Notice under section 8(2))

SITE FORMATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE WORKS

FOR PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS AT KAM TIN SOUTH, YUEN LONG

Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Housing under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. 60336159/GAZZ/100, 60336159/GAZZ/101 and 60336159/GAZZ/102 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plans and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) widening of a section of the existing Kam Po Road to a single two-lane carriageway;
- (ii) construction of single two-lane carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, bicycle parking, central reserves/refuge islands, verges, run-ins/run-outs and pedestrian crossings;
- (iii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing carriageways into footpaths, cycle track, central reserves/refuge islands, verges and pedestrian crossings;
- (iv) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing footpaths into carriageways, cycle tracks, central reserves/refuge islands, verges, run-ins/run-outs and pedestrian crossings;
- (v) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing cycle tracks into carriageways, footpaths, central reserve/refuge island, verges and pedestrian crossings;
- (vi) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing central reserves/refuge islands into carriageways;
- (vii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing verges into carriageways, footpath, cycle track, central reserve/refuge island and pedestrian crossings;
- (viii) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing run-ins/run-outs into carriageway, footpath, cycle track and verge;
- (ix) permanent closure and conversion of sections of the existing pedestrian crossings into carriageways, footpaths and verge;
- (x) permanent closure and conversion of the pedestrian crossings under PWP Item No. 7804CL as described in G.N. 1641 of 2016 and authorized as per G.N. 6620 of 2016 into footpath and verge;
- (xi) temporary closure and modification of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central reserves/refuge islands, verges and pedestrian crossing;
- (xii) temporary closure of sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, central reserves/refuge islands, verges, run-ins/run-outs and pedestrian crossings; and
- (xiii) ancillary works including landscaping, drainage, sewerage, water, street lighting and utilities works, and installation of street furniture and traffic aids.

The objector should describe his interest and the manner in which he alleges that he will be affected by the works or the use in his notice of objection. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Housing not later than 23rd day of April 2019.

Personal Information Collection Statement

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Transport and Housing in connection with any written objections/comments will be used for the processing of the objections/comments and other related purposes. The provision of any information, including the personal data, other than the information as required under section 10(2) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) is voluntary. However, it may not be possible to process the objections/comments if such information, including the personal data, is not sufficiently provided. Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments and other persons, organizations or agencies which are required to handle the objections/comments and related matters. Persons who have so submitted their personal data have the rights to request access to and correction of their personal data held by us. Request for access to or correction of the personal data should be made in writing to the Personal Data Privacy Officer of the Transport and Housing Bureau (Transport Branch) at 20th Floor, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong.
