

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ORDINANCE (Chapter 159)

ORDER THAT A SOLICITOR BE SUSPENDED FROM PRACTISING
CHEUNG JACKSON

In accordance with section 12(2) of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance (Chapter 159), I hereby give notice that on 4 April 2019 a Solicitors Disciplinary Tribunal ('the Tribunal') found a complaint against Cheung Jackson ('Mr Cheung') proved. The complaint was that Mr Cheung on 18 May 2017 engaged in conduct unbecoming a solicitor, thereby compromising his integrity, his own reputation and the reputation of the profession, contrary to common law.

The Tribunal ordered that:—

- (1) Mr Cheung be censured;
- (2) Mr Cheung be suspended from practice for a period of two years from the filing of this Order by the Clerk to the Tribunal with the Registrar of the High Court, with the condition that when Mr Cheung resumes practice after the suspension, he is prohibited from practicing as a sole proprietor or partner or manager of a solicitors' firm until the Law Society is satisfied that he is fit to do so;
- (3) Mr Cheung do pay to the Law Society of Hong Kong agreed costs of HK\$32,442.91 within 28 days from the Clerk to the Tribunal's filing of this Order; and
- (4) Mr Cheung do pay to the Clerk to the Tribunal agreed costs of HK\$20,600 within 28 days from the Clerk to the Tribunal's filing of this Order.

The Order of the Tribunal dated 4 April 2019 and the Corrigenda dated 9 April 2019 were filed by the Clerk to the Tribunal with the Registrar on 29 April 2019.
