

## ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

(Notice under section 18)

WIDENING OF TAI PO ROAD (SHA TIN SECTION)

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing at-grade carriageways, elevated carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, subway, subways for cycle track, central medians and staircases within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. ST2075, ST2076 and ST2077 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as amended by Amendment Plan No. ST2086 ('the Amendment Plan') and described in the amendment scheme annexed thereto. The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 6048 published on 14 August 2015 and 21 August 2015. The Amendment Plan and amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 6617 published on 25 November 2016 and 2 December 2016. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Housing (Transport) has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 5 November 2019 to 4 November 2020, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing at-grade carriageways, elevated carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, subway, subways for cycle track, central medians and staircases to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the widening of Tai Po Road between Sha Tin Rural Committee Road and Man Wo House, modification of the existing interchange at Sha Tin Rural Committee Road, modification of the substructure and staircase of the existing footbridge No. NF40 at Wo Che Street, modification of the substructure of the existing footbridge No. NF66 connecting Ha Wo Che and Wo Che Estate, construction of at-grade carriageways, elevated carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, subway for cycle track, central median, semi-enclosure noise barriers, semi-enclosure noise barriers with 2-metre cantilevers, vertical noise barriers, vertical noise barriers with 2-metre cantilevers and staircases, construction of lifts at the junction of Tai Po Road/Shan Tin Rural Committee Road, and other ancillary works.

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected at-grade carriageways, elevated carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, subway, subways for cycle track, central medians and staircases on 25 October 2019.

Any person entitled to compensation under the Ordinance may serve upon the Secretary for Transport and Housing a written claim, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction:—

- (1) By post or by hand to the Transport and Housing Bureau's Dropin Box No. 6 located at the 2nd Floor Entrance, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong. The box is available for use between 8.00 a.m. and 7.00 p.m. from Monday to Friday (except public holidays);
