SCHEDULE

Foreshore and sea-bed affected

Approximately 5.20 hectares of foreshore and sea-bed situated at the Tsang Kok Stream Outfall between the West New Territories Landfill and T·PARK as delineated and shown edged red on a plan, numbered TMM4265, deposited in the Land Registry.

Description of the undertaking and the manner in which the foreshore and sea-bed will be affected by the proposed undertaking

- (i) Filling of the sea-bed to form land with a total area of approximately 3.01 hectares;
- (ii) Construction of a seawall with a total length of approximately 210 metres along the northern end of the above-mentioned land.
