TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close permanently sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths and tracks; and close temporarily sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, tracks and open places within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. 188843/B&V/GZ/001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto. The Plan and scheme were referred to in G.N. 4510 published on 22 June 2018 and 29 June 2018. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that as from 24 March 2023, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths and tracks to be permanently closed, shall be extinguished; and from 24 March 2023 to 23 March 2024, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, tracks and open places to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the widening and modification of a section of carriageway at Victoria Road; the construction of a vehicular access connecting the proposed public housing development to Victoria Road; the construction of a covered footbridge and two lift towers with associated staircases and lifts connecting the proposed public housing development and Ka Wai Man Road to Victoria Road; the construction of footpath and bus lay-by; and other ancillary works.
