- (vii) deletion of the originally proposed permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing carriageway into a vehicular bridge;
- (viii) deletion of the originally proposed permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing footpath into a footbridge;
- (ix) deletion of the originally proposed temporary closure and reconstruction of sections of the existing carriageway and footpath;
- (x) revision of the area of land proposed to be resumed in respect of the following:—
