Notice is hereby given that under powers delegated by the Secretary for Transport and Logistics under section 3(3) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance'), the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics proposes to execute the road works within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. SK/2001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto. The Plan and scheme have been deposited in the Land Registry.

The general nature of the proposed works is as follows:—

- (i) construction of a carriageway, a footpath, pedestrian crossings and a central reserve/refuge island;
- (ii) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing carriageway into a footpath;
- (iii) permanent closure and conversion of a section of the existing footpath into a carriageway;
- (iv) permanent closure and demolition of sections of the existing carriageway and footpaths;
- (v) temporary closure and reinstatement of a section of the existing carriageway and footpath; and
- (vi) ancillary works including drainage, water, street lighting and utility works.

Any objection lodged on a ground relating to any compensation (whether monetary or non-monetary) or any financial or other assistance in connection with the works or the use is, to the extent that it is lodged on that ground, invalid and treated as not having been lodged for the purposes of section 11 of the Ordinance. Objectors are requested to provide contact details to facilitate communication. A notice of objection should be delivered to the Secretary for Transport and Logistics not later than the 9th day of January 2024.
