

ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)  
(Notice under section 18)

WAN CHAI DEVELOPMENT PHASE II—PROPOSED ROAD WORKS

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close permanently sections of the existing at-grade carriageway; and close temporarily sections of the existing at-grade carriageways and footpaths within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. GAZ/1000 to GAZ/1003 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as amended by Amendment Plan No. GAZ/1003/01 ('the Amendment Plan') and described in the amendment scheme annexed thereto. The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 4768 published on 27 July 2007 and 3 August 2007. The Amendment Plan and amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 5193 published on 1 September 2023 and 8 September 2023. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that as from 23 April 2024, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over sections of the existing at-grade carriageway to be permanently closed, shall be extinguished; and from 23 April 2024 to 22 April 2025, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing at-grade carriageways and footpaths to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve:—

- (i) demolition of sections of carriageways and footpaths;
- (ii) relocation of bus terminus;
- (iii) reconstruction of carriageways, footpaths, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands;
- (iv) modification of carriageways, loading/unloading lay-bys and footpaths;
- (v) realignment of carriageways and footpaths;
- (vi) construction of carriageways, loading/unloading lay-bys, roundabouts, footpaths, pedestrian landscaped decks, coach parks, amenity areas, central reserves/refuge islands and a pedestrian crossing; and
- (vii) other ancillary works, including drainage, landscaping and earth works.

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected at-grade carriageways and footpaths on 12 April 2024.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Ordinance may serve upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics a written claim, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction:—
