TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central medians/traffic islands and pedestrian crossings within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. RDO6175TB-GZ0001 and RDO6175TB-GZ0002 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto. The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 8235 published on 30 October 2015 and 6 November 2015. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 15 May 2024 to 14 May 2025, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central medians/traffic islands and pedestrian crossings to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the construction of a lift tower with three lifts and associated footpath adjacent to Hing Shing Road, the construction of an elevated walkway with two columns to connect the above lift tower and associated footpath adjacent to Kwai Shing Circuit, the construction of footpath at Ko Fong Street and other ancillary works.
